WHERE HARVEST PERIODS APPLY

1 Short title

This notice may be cited as the *Nature Conservation (Duck and Quail Harvest Period) Notice 2001*.

2 Harvest period for ducks—northern and central region

(1) A harvest period for ducks for the northern and central region starts on 7 July 2001 and ends on 30 September 2001.

(2) The harvest period applies only in the northern and central region.

(3) In this section—

“**northern and central region**” means the areas of the local governments stated in the schedule, part 1, item 1.

3 Harvest period for ducks—southern region

(1) A harvest period for ducks for the southern region starts on 16 June 2001 and ends on 9 September 2001.

(2) The harvest period applies only in the southern region.

(3) In this section—

“**southern region**” means the areas of the local governments stated in the schedule, part 1, item 2.

4 Conditions on taking ducks

A person must not—

(a) shoot a duck if—

(i) the duck is not in flight; or

(ii) the person is in a moving boat; or

(b) take more than 12 ducks, regardless of species, in a period of 24 hours; or

(c) have in possession at a place, other than the person’s usual place of residence, more than 30 ducks, regardless of species; or

(d) use lead shot to take ducks at the following places—

(i) Greenlakes;

- (ii) Lisgar Station;
- (iii) Lake Powlathanga.

5 Harvest period for quails

(1) A harvest period for quails starts on 19 May 2001 and ends on 5 August 2001.

(2) The harvest period applies only in the areas of the local governments stated in the schedule, part 2.

6 Conditions on taking quails

A person must not—

- (a) take more than 25 quails, regardless of species, in a period of 24 hours; or
- (b) have in possession at a place, other than the person's usual place of residence, more than 60 quails, regardless of species.

7 Expiry

This notice expires on 30 September 2001.
