#### STANDARD TIME ACT 1894

#### An Act to establish a standard of time in the colony of Queensland

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a standard of time in Queensland, and to declare the mean time of the 150th meridian of longitude east of Greenwich in England to be such standard time throughout Queensland.

#### 1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Standard Time Act 1894.

#### 2 Commencement of Act

This Act shall commence and take effect on and from the 1 January 1895.

#### 3 The time of the 150th meridian to be standard time

The mean time of the 150th meridian of longitude east of Greenwich in England shall be deemed and is hereby declared to be standard time throughout Queensland.

#### 4 The time mentioned in Acts etc. to mean standard time

Whenever any expression of time occurs in any Act, order in council, rule, regulation, by-law, deed, or in any instrument whatsoever, and whenever the doing or not doing anything at a certain time of day or night, or during a certain part of the day or the night, has an effect in law, such time shall, unless it is otherwise specifically stated, be held to be standard time throughout Queensland as declared by this Act.
