## Plumbing and Drainage Regulation 2003

[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 2 July 2004]

## Part 1 Preliminary

#### 1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Plumbing and Drainage Regulation 2003*.

#### 2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 1 November 2003.

#### 3 Definitions

The dictionary in schedule 5 defines particular words used in this regulation.

## Part 2 Licences and equivalence

## 4 Licence required for performing regulated and minor work

A person may perform regulated work or minor work only if the person has a licence to perform the work.<sup>1</sup>

## 5 Qualifications and practical experience for plumbers and drainers licences—Act, s 37(a)

(1) For section 37(a) of the Act, the qualifications and practical experience required for a plumbers licence and for a drainers licence are stated in schedule 1.

(2) The qualifications and practical experience prescribed for a licence mentioned in schedule 1 apply for a licence that is issued for work that is within the scope of work stated in schedule 1, column 4, for the licence.

# 6 Qualifications and practical experience for restricted licences—Act, s 37(a)

- (1) For section 37(a) of the Act, the qualifications and practical experience required for particular types of restricted licences are stated in schedule 2.
- (2) The scope of work for a particular type of restricted licence is the scope of work stated for the type of restricted licence in schedule 2, column 4.

#### 7 Endorsements on licences

- (1) For section 37(a) of the Act, the qualifications and practical experience required for particular endorsements on plumbers licences or drainers licences are stated in schedule 3.
- (2) The scope of work for a particular endorsement is the scope of work stated for the endorsement in schedule 3, column 4.

#### 8 Duration of endorsement

An endorsement on a plumbers licence or drainers licence remains in force for the period stated in the licence but for no longer than the licence itself remains in force.

### 9 Referral to registered training organisation

(1) This section applies, for section 37<sup>2</sup> of the Act, if—

<sup>2</sup> Section 37 (Entitlement to licence) of the Act

- (a) a person applies, or indicates to the board that the person proposes to apply, to the board under section 36<sup>3</sup> of the Act for a licence; and
- (b) it is, or will be, necessary for deciding the application for the board to be satisfied a qualification held by the person (the *alternative qualification*) is at least equivalent to a qualification mentioned in schedule 1, column 2, item 1(a) or (b) or item 2(a) or (b).
- (2) The board may refer the person to a registered training organisation if the board is satisfied the only practicable way to obtain the necessary information for deciding on the equivalence of the alternative qualification is for the applicant's actual competencies to be assessed.
- (3) If the person is referred, and applies, to a registered training organisation, the board must take all reasonable steps to ensure the registered training organisation, as soon as practicable after receiving the referral—
  - (a) carries out its assessment of the person's competencies; and
  - (b) advises the board of the results of its assessment.
- (4) The person must comply with any reasonable requirement of the registered training organisation for its assessment of the person's competencies.

## Part 3 Miscellaneous

#### 10 Fees

The fees in schedule 4 are payable to the board for the matters stated in the schedule.

section 3

*apprenticeship* see the *Training and Employment Act* 2000, section 7.4

certificate of competency, for plumbing or drainage, means a certificate in plumbing or drainage that is in force and recognised under the Australia-New Zealand Reciprocity Association Agreement.

competencies, for a particular licence or endorsement, means the competencies decided by a registered training organisation, and approved by the council, for the licence or endorsement.

*council* means the Training Recognition Council established under the *Training and Employment Act 2000*, section 167.

foreign licence means a licence issued by a foreign licensing authority that is in force and recognised under the Australia-New Zealand Reciprocity Association Agreement.

plumbing and draining apprenticeship means employment based training in plumbing and draining that is declared by the council to be an apprenticeship under the *Training and Employment Act 2000*, section 183.<sup>5</sup>

*registered training organisation* see the *Training and Employment Act 2000*, section 14.6
