Public Health (Further Extension of Declared Public Health Emergency—Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)) Regulation 2020

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Public Health (Further Extension of Declared Public Health Emergency—Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)) Regulation 2020*.

2 Further extension of period of declared public health emergency—Act, s 323

- (1) This section applies to the declared public health emergency—
- (a) declared by the Minister on 29 January 2020 under section 319(2) of the Act; and
 - (b) extended by the *Public Health (Extension of Declared Public Health Emergency—Coronavirus (2019-nCoV)) Regulation 2020* on 5 February 2020 under section 323(1) of the Act.
- (2) The period of the declared public health emergency is further extended under section 323(1) of the Act by 7 days.

Editor's note—

The period of the declared public health emergency is now extended until the end of the day on 19 February 2020.

Notes—

- 1 Under section 323(2) of the Act, this regulation commences on the day it is made whether or not it is notified on that day.
- 2 Under section 323(4)(b) of the Act, this regulation expires at the end of the extended period unless it is sooner repealed or it expires under section 324(3) of the Act.
