From the Trust and Special Funds the sum of Fifty thousand pounds; and

From the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account the sum of Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant.

2. The Treasurer of the State shall issue and pay the said several sums for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for sums paid in pursuance of warrant.

3. The Treasurer shall, in his accounts, from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

**An Act to Authorise the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland of further Sums towards the Service of the Year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1902.**

[ASSENTED TO 26TH SEPTEMBER, 1901.]

Preamble.

**W**HEREAS we, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the members of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, have in the present Session of Parliament cheerfully granted to your Majesty the sum hereinafter mentioned towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and two, in addition to the sums already granted during the present Session of Parliament towards the same services: And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland the sum granted to your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent

*Appropriation Act No. 2.*

Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. In addition to the sums of Four hundred thousand pounds already applied from the Consolidated Revenue Fund (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account), Fifty thousand pounds already applied from the Trust and Special Funds, and Two hundred and fifty thousand pounds already applied from the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account towards the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and two, by “ *The Appropriation Act of 1901-1902, No. 1,*”\* there shall and may be issued and applied towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and two, the further sums following, that is to say,—

Appropriation.

From the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Queensland (exclusive of the moneys standing to the credit of the Loan Fund Account) the sum of Three hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

2. The Treasurer of the State shall issue and pay the said sum for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, to such persons, upon such days, and in such proportions as the Governor, by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State.

Treasurer to pay moneys as directed by warrant.

3. The Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for sums paid in pursuance of warrant.

4. This Act may be cited as “ *The Appropriation Act of 1901-1902, No. 2.*”
