B<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legisby and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as "The Australian Short title Consular Officers' Notarial Powers and Evidence Act construction. Amendment Act of 1949," and shall be read as one with \*" The Australian Consular Officers' Notarial Powers and Evidence Act of 1946," herein referred to as the Principal

The Principal Act and this Act may be collectively title. cited as "The Australian Consular Officers' Notarial Powers and Evidence Acts, 1946 to 1949."

2. Section two of the Principal Act is amended by Amendment repealing the definition "Australian Consular Officer" and by inserting, in lieu of that repealed definition, the following definition, namely:

" "Australian Consular Officer" — An Australian Australian ambassador, envoy, minister, chargé d'affaires, Officer. secretary of embassy or legation, consul-general, consul, vice-consul, or consular agent, or any person acting in any such office in any country or place.

Amendment

3. The amendment of the Principal Act made by to operate this Act shall be deemed to have been so made on the retro-spectively. twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and this Act shall have retrospective operation and effect on and from that date accordingly.
