An Act to Declare the Scope of certain Provisions of "The Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1957."

B E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. (1.) This Act may be cited as "The Constitution Acts Amendment Act of 1959."

Collective title.

(2.) *" The Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1957," and this Act may be collectively cited as "The Constitution Acts, 1867 to 1959."

Application.

(3.) This Act applies as well to members of the present and every past Legislative Assembly as to the members of every Legislative Assembly hereafter to be summoned and chosen.

- 2. *" The Constitution Act of 1867," as heretofore New s. 7A amended, is further amended by inserting after section inserted. seven thereof, the following section:-
- "[7A.] (1.)  - (b) To any lease, license, authority, permit or other contract or agreement relating to mining, dredging, searching, or prospecting for, or the obtaining of, petroleum, coal, gold or any other mineral in or on any Crown land in Queensland;
 - (c) To any contract or agreement with the Insurance Commissioner under and within the meaning of §" The Workers' Compensation Acts. 1916 to 1959," and ||" The Insurance

- Acts, 1916 to 1940," in relation to any class of insurance business carried on by the said Commissioner as representing the Crown;
- (d) To any contract or agreement securing the repayment of the principal, or the payment of interest on, or both the repayment of principal and the payment of interest on, moneys lent to the Crown or to any Crown corporation or instrumentality or corporation or instrumentality representing the Crown."

Savings.

- 3. (1.) Any suit, action or proceeding against a member of the present Legislative Assembly instituted under section seven of *" The Constitution Act of 1867," as heretofore amended, before, and pending at, the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, may be carried on and prosecuted by the person who instituted it as if this Act had not been passed, and no such suit, action or proceeding shall be affected by this Act.
- (2.) A member of the present Legislative Assembly shall not by virtue only of the continuance against him of any suit, action or proceeding specified in subsection one of this section, or the recovery against him therein of any forfeiture prescribed by section seven of *"The Constitution Act of 1867," as heretofore amended, be, or be deemed ever to have been, disabled or incapable to sit or vote in the present Legislative Assembly, or liable to have his seat declared by the present Legislative Assembly to be void.
