1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Anti-Discrimination Regulation 2005*.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 1 September 2005.

3 Witness fees and expenses

A person appearing as a witness before the tribunal is entitled to be paid as fees and expenses the amounts that would be payable under the *Uniform Civil Procedure (Fees) Regulation 1999* (the **regulation**), part 4¹ if—

- (a) the person were appearing as a witness before a court; and
- (b) the reference in section 16(1) of the regulation to the registrar were a reference to the registrar of the tribunal; and
- (c) the reference in section 17 of the regulation to the *Supreme Court of Queensland Act 1991* were a reference to the Act.
