## Division 1 Preliminary

## 3A Definitions for part

In this part—

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health worker means a person who holds—

- (a) a Certificate III in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care; or
- (b) a qualification in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander primary health that is higher than the qualification mentioned in paragraph (a).

*practice plan*, for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health worker, means a document in the approved form—

- (a) developed and signed by the worker and the primary clinical supervisor for the worker; and
- (b) stating the circumstances and conditions for the worker to administer a medicine.

*primary clinical supervisor*, for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health worker, means the person who has primary responsibility for supervising the clinical work performed by the worker for the worker's employment in a relevant health service.
