“ member ” of a statutory authority means a person—	9

(b) for whom the authority is liable to pay the superannuation guarantee charge if it does not meet the minimum level of superannuation support prescribed under the <i>Superannuation Guarantee (Administration) Act 1992</i> (Cwlth);	13 14 15 16
“ statutory authority ” means a body corporate established under an Act;	17
“ superannuation guarantee charge ” means the charge imposed by the <i>Superannuation Guarantee Charge Act 1992</i> (Cwlth).	18 19

<i>Clause4.(1)</i> A statutory authority may—	21
(a) establish and amend a superannuation scheme for its members; or	22 23
(b) join in establishing and amending a superannuation scheme for its members; or	24 25

(c) take part in a superannuation scheme for its members.

(2) However, a statutory authority may not establish or take part in a superannuation scheme that does not satisfy the superannuation fund conditions under the *Occupational Superannuation Standards Act 1987* (Cwlth).

(3) For the purposes of subsection (1), a statutory authority may establish and keep any fund.

Regulation making power

Clause 5. The Governor in Council may make regulations under this Act.
