(b) relates to all or any of the prescribed land under section 722D or 722E; and	4
(c) was current immediately before the commencement day.	5

'722D Persons who may apply for, or be granted, a mining lease for land covered by MDLA364	7
‘(1) For the prescribed period, a mining lease in respect of all or any of the prescribed land can only be applied for by, or granted to, the prescribed persons.	8
