- *(1) As soon as practicable after a registered digital photo accessed
 by a police officer under this part or a prescribed smartcard
 Act is no longer required for the purpose for which it was
 accessed, the police officer who accessed the photo must
 destroy all copies of it obtained from the access.
- (2) If a registered digital photo is accessed under section 195E 21 and a post-access approval order is not obtained for the photo, 22 the police officer who accessed the photo must destroy all 23 copies of it obtained from the access as soon as practicable 24 after—25
 - (a) unless paragraph (b) applies, the 28 days mentioned in 26 section 195H(2) ends; or 27
 - (b) if the commissioner starts an appeal under that section 28 in relation to the access—the appeal is finally decided. 29
- '(3) The destruction of a registered digital photo under this section 30 must be carried out in the presence of a justice.'. 31
