for

An Act to amend the *Holidays Act 1983* and the *Industrial Relations Act 1999* to restore the days on which public holidays are to be observed for Labour Day and the Birthday of the Sovereign, and to amend the *Adult Proof of Age Card Act 2008*, the *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000*, the *Tow Truck Act 1973*, the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994*, the *Transport Operations (Passenger Transport) Act 1994*, the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Act 1995* and the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994* for particular purposes [s 1]
