NATURE CONSERVATION (PROTECTED AREAS) REGULATION 1994

[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 7 January 2000]

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

Short title

1. This regulation may be cited as the *Nature Conservation (Protected Areas) Regulation 1994.*

Definitions

- 2. In this regulation—
- **"bioregion"** means a biogeographical region shown on the map titled 'Biogeographic Regions of Queensland' held by the department.¹
- "forestry chief executive" means the chief executive of the department that deals with matters arising under the *Forestry Act 1959*.
- "Great Barrier Reef Region" has the meaning given by the *Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Act 1975* (Cwlth).
- "Maclennan Cay" has the meaning given by the *Meaker Trust (Raine Island Research) Act 1981*.
- "mining chief executive" means the chief executive of the department that deals with matters arising under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*.
- "Moulter Cay" has the meaning given by the Meaker Trust (Raine Island Research) Act 1981.

"Raine Island" has the meaning given by the Meaker Trust (Raine Island Research) Act 1981.

PART 2—PROTECTED AREAS (STATE LAND)

Dedication and naming of national parks (scientific)

- **3.** Each of the areas of Crown land described in schedule 1, column 2 is—
 - (a) dedicated as a national park (scientific); and
 - (b) assigned the name set out opposite it in the schedule, column 1.

Dedication and naming of national parks

- **4.** Each of the areas of Crown land described in schedule 2, column 2 is—
 - (a) dedicated as a national park; and
 - (b) assigned the name set out opposite it in the schedule, column 1.

Dedication and naming of conservation parks

- **5.(1)** Each of the areas of Crown land described in schedule 3, column 2 is—
 - (a) dedicated as a conservation park; and
 - (b) assigned the name set out opposite it in the schedule, column 1.
- (2) Each conservation park set out in schedule 3A, column 1 is placed under the management of the trustees set out opposite it in schedule 3A, column 2.

Dedication, naming and trustees of resources reserves

- **6.** Each of the areas of Crown land described in schedule 4, column 2 is—
 - (a) dedicated as a resources reserve; and
 - (b) assigned the name set out opposite it in the schedule, column 1; and
 - (c) in the cases specified—placed under the management of the trustees set out opposite it in the schedule, column 3.

PART 3—NATURE REFUGES

Declaration and naming of nature refuges

- 7. Each of the areas of land described in schedule 5 is—
 - (a) declared a nature refuge; and
 - (b) assigned the name specified in the schedule.

Declared management intent

- **8.**(1) The declared management intent for a nature refuge is specified in schedule 5.
- (2) Subsection (1) has effect subject to the Act, section 22 (Management principles of nature refuges).

Duration

9. The duration of the declaration of a nature refuge is stated in schedule 5.

PART 4—COORDINATED CONSERVATION AREAS

Declaration and naming of coordinated conservation areas

- **10.** Each of the areas of land described in schedule 6 is—
 - (a) declared a coordinated conservation area; and
 - (b) assigned the name specified in the schedule.

Interim management intent

- **11.(1)** The interim management intent for a coordinated conservation area is stated in schedule 6.
 - (2) Subsection (1) has effect subject to sections 17 and 23² of the Act.

Duration

12. The duration of the declaration of a coordinated conservation area is stated in schedule 6.

PART 5—MISCELLANEOUS

Reference to plan

- **13.** In the description of an area in a schedule, a reference to a plan, the number of which uses—
 - (a) the prefix 'NPW' or 'PA'—is a reference to a plan held by and available for inspection in the department; and

- (b) the prefix FTY'—is a reference to a plan held by and available for inspection in the department that deals with matters arising under the *Forestry Act 1959*; and
- (c) any other prefix—is a reference to a plan held by and available for inspection in the department that deals with matters arising under the *Land Act 1994*.

Reference to document in sch 5

14. In schedule 5, a reference to the document titled 'The Conservation Status of Queensland's Bioregional Ecosystems' is a reference to the document of that name published by the department.³'.

 - (a) a significant area of semi-evergreen vine forest and grassy open eucalypt forest; and
 - (b) steep ridgelands that provide a buffer against residential development.

Declared management intent and use

- **234.** The nature refuge will be managed, under the conservation agreement between the land-holder and the Minister, to allow—
 - (a) the keeping of a domestic dog if it is under the control of the land-holder or a person authorised by the land-holder; and

- (b) pistol shooting activities in the nature refuge; and
- (c) access by special interest groups for nature based recreation and scientific research; and
- (d) construction and maintenance of minimal disturbance walking tracks.

Duration

(a) five regional ecosystems, within the wet tropics bioregion, identified as endangered in The Conservation Status of Queensland's Bioregional Ecosystems; and

Declared management intent and use

- **239.** The nature refuge will be managed, under the conservation agreement between the land-holder and the Minister, to allow—
 - (a) the use of a guide dog in the nature refuge; and
 - (b) keeping of no more than 2 domestic dogs if they are under the control of the land-holder or a person authorised by the land-holder; and
 - (c) limited removal of timber by the land-holder for fencing the nature refuge; and
 - (d) limited harvesting of lawyer cane (*Calamus* spp.), supplejack (*Flagellaria* spp.) and tree bark for making aboriginal artifacts; and
 - (e) limited harvesting of fish, turtles and plants in the nature refuge by members of the Yabullumbarra aboriginal clan for human consumption, or educational or medicinal purposes; and
 - (f) access by special interest groups for nature based recreation and scientific research; and
 - (g) construction and maintenance of minimal disturbance walking tracks.

 - (a) 3 areas, each of which is the subject of a separate conservation agreement; and
 - (b) Venman Bushland National Park.
- (2) The coordinated conservation area will be managed to—
 - (a) conserve the area's koala population and habitat; and
 - (b) conserve the area's habitat for aquatic native animals; and
 - (c) allow for a range of recreational activities, including horseriding; and
 - (d) allow for educational activities; and
 - (e) allow quarrying and commercial beekeeping on parts of the area; and
 - (f) control the landing of aircraft; and
 - (g) maintain the interests of the land-holders who are parties to the agreements.
