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Major Events (Townsville 400) Regulation 2015

[reprinted as in force on 29 May 2015]

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Major Events (Townsville 400) Regulation 2015*.

2 Definition

In this regulation—

Townsville 400 means the major event prescribed under section 3.

3 Townsville 400 is a major event

For section 12(1) of the Act, the V8 Supercars motor racing event known as the Townsville 400 to be held in 2015 is a major event.

4 Major event organiser for Townsville 400

For section 12(2)(a) of the Act, V8 Supercars Australia Pty Ltd ACN 077 053 484 is the major event organiser for the Townsville 400.

5 Major event area for Townsville 400

For section 12(2)(b) of the Act, the major event area for the Townsville 400 is the area surrounding the Townsville Civic Theatre shown on the map in schedule 1 as the major event area.

6 Major event period for Townsville 400

For section 12(2)(c) of the Act, the major event period for the Townsville 400 is the period between midday on Thursday 9 July 2015 and midday on Monday 13 July 2015.

7 Application of Act provisions to Townsville 400

For sections 17 and 55 of the Act, the following provisions of the Act are prescribed, under section 12(2)(d) of the Act, to apply to the Townsville 400 and the major event area for the major event period—

- (a) sections 16, 18(1) to (4), (6), (7) and (9), 19 to 28, 31, 36 and 40;
- (b) part 6.

8 Carrying out temporary works for Townsville 400

For section 16(2) of the Act, the following periods, dates inclusive, are prescribed—

- (a) between 1 June 2015 and midday on 9 July 2015;
- (b) between midday on 13 July 2015 and 1 August 2015.

9 Display of poster prescribed prohibited conduct

- (1) For section 20(6)(h) of the Act, displaying a poster on a property inside the major event area, including on the outside of a building or structure, is prescribed.
- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a poster displayed by a person if the poster—
 - (a) was displayed before the major event period; and
 - (b) was displayed in the course of the person's ordinary activities.

10 Declaration of official title for Townsville 400

For section 51(1)(b) of the Act, the title ‘2015 Castrol EDGE Townsville 400’ is declared an official title for the Townsville 400.

11 Persons who may be appointed as authorised persons

For section 56(1)(d) of the Act, crowd controllers under the *Security Providers Act 1993* are prescribed for the Townsville 400.

12 Limitation on particular authorised person’s powers

- (1) This section limits, for section 57(2) of the Act, the powers of particular authorised persons for the Townsville 400.
- (2) The powers of an authorised person who is not a police officer do not include the powers stated in sections 25, 54, 63 and 65 of the Act.

13 Application of laws to roads

For section 80(1)(b) of the Act, each road shown in the major event area on the map in schedule 1 ceases to be a road for the major event period.
