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## Tattoo Industry Regulation 2013

## 1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Tattoo Industry Regulation* 2013.

## 2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 6 January 2014.

## 3 Replacement of licence

- (1) This section applies if the chief executive is satisfied that a person is the holder of a licence that has been lost, stolen or destroyed.
- (2) The chief executive may, on the payment of the fee stated in schedule 1, issue a replacement licence to the person.

#### 4 Fees

The fees payable under the Act are stated in schedule 1.

## 5 Partial refund of fees

The chief executive must refund a reasonable amount of a fee paid on an application for a licence, or the renewal of a licence, if—

- (a) the chief executive refuses to grant or renew the licence; or
- (b) the applicant withdraws the application before the licence is granted or renewed.
