General outline

Short title

Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment Notice (No. 1) 2011.

Authorising law

Section 13 of the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Act 1990*.

Policy objectives and the reasons for them

The *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Notice 2010* (Notice) declares membership of the State Public Sector Superannuation Scheme for persons employed by a unit of the State public sector. This amendment reflects minor changes to the schedule of the Notice. In particular, it formalises the membership arrangements for employees of Queensland Water Infrastructure Pty Ltd, amends the schedule entry for employees who were employed under s147 of the *Public Service Act 2008* to reflect they are now employed under the *Ministerial and Other Office Holder Staff Act 2010*, and reflects a name change for Screen Queensland Pty Ltd, formerly known as Pacific Film and Television Pty Ltd.

Achievement of policy objectives

The *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment Notice (No. 1) 2011* achieves the policy objectives of providing eligible membership for those persons who are employed by a unit of the State public sector.

Consistency with policy objectives of authorising law

This amendment is consistent with the policy of the authorising law in that regulations can be made in order to administer the QSuper scheme.

Inconsistency with policy objectives of other legislation

This amendment is not inconsistent with the policy objectives of other legislation.

Benefits and costs of implementation

It is not expected that the implementation of this amendment will result in significant costs.

Consistency with fundamental legislative principles

The *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment Notice (No. 1) 2011* is consistent with fundamental legislative principles. This amendment provides membership to QSuper for employees of certain employers that have a strong link to the Queensland Government.

Consultation

Consultation has occurred with the Department of the Premier and Cabinet, the relevant employers and the Office of the Queensland Parliamentary Counsel.
