# Economic Development (Vegetation Management) By-law 2013

### Explanatory Notes for SL 2013 No. 3

made under the *Economic Development Act 2012* 

## **General outline**

#### Short title

Economic Development (Vegetation Management) By-law 2013.

#### Authorising law

Section 54 of the Economic Development Act 2012.

#### Policy objectives and the reasons for them

The purpose of the By-law is to continue the effect under the Economic Development Act of an existing Vegetation Management By-law that had effect under the repealed *Urban Land Development Authority Act 2007*.

#### Achievement of policy objectives

The making of the Economic Development Regulation 2013.

#### Consistency with policy objectives of authorising law

The By-law is consistent with the powers assigned under the *Economic Development Act 2012* that allows for the making of By-laws, to regulate interference with vegetation in Priority development areas.

#### Inconsistency with policy objectives of other legislation

There is no inconsistency with the policy objectives of other legislation.

#### Benefits and costs of implementation

This By-law continues the effect of the By-law made under the *Urban Land Development Authority Act* 2007 and allows for the continuing management of protected vegetation within three urban development areas.

#### Consistency with fundamental legislative principles

The subordinate legislation is consistent with the fundamental legislative principles of the *Legislative Standards Act 1992*.

#### Consultation

There has been no consultation undertaken specifically about this regulation as it transitions the existing Urban Land Development Authority (Vegetation Management) By-law to the Economic Development (Vegetation Management) By-law 2013.

Treasury and Trade has confirmed that the making of the regulation does not require a Regulatory Principles Checklist or Preliminary Impact Assessment, Regulatory Impact Statement process.
