Policy objectives and the reasons for them

The objective of this subordinate legislation is to postpone the expiry of the *Water Plan* (Calliope River Basin) 2006.

The Water Plan (Calliope River Basin) 2006 continues to be appropriate for the plan area and plan strategies are achieving the desired outcomes with potential risks assessed as low. The level of demand for water in the catchment remains low and there are no expected adverse impacts of the postponement of plan expiry on water entitlement holders or natural ecosystems in the plan area.

Achievement of policy objectives

The policy objectives are achieved through the notice, which is declared to be subordinate legislation under section 56(2) of the *Water Act 2000*.

Consistency with policy objectives of authorising law

This notice is consistent with the objectives of the *Water Act 2000*.

Inconsistency with policy objectives of other legislation

The notice is not inconsistent with the policy objectives of other legislation.

Benefits and costs of implementation

There are no costs associated with implementation of this notice.

Consistency with fundamental legislative principles

The notice is consistent with fundamental legislative principles.

Consultation

A notice outlining the proposed new expiry date for the plan and the reasons for the proposed postponement was published on the Department of Natural Resources and Mines website and advertised in the Gladstone Observer. Public submissions received were considered in making a final decision to postpone the expiry of the *Water Plan (Calliope River Basin)* 2006.

The Office of Best Practice Regulation has previously been consulted in relation to this type of notice and has confirmed that a Regulatory Impact Statement is not required.
