## General Outline

### Short title

Proclamation made under the *Community Services (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 2020*.

### Authorising law

Section 2 of the *Community Services (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 2020*.

### Policy objectives and the reasons for them

The objective of the Proclamation is to commence the amendments to the *Youth Justice Act 1992* (the YJ Act) and the *Bail Act 1980* (the Bail Act) made by the *Community Services (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 2020* (the Act).

The Act amends the YJ Act to streamline the bail decision-making process, with increased clarity that community safety is a paramount consideration.

The specific provisions of the Act will commence on 15 July 2020.

The commencement date of 15 July 2020 allows sufficient time for a range of implementation activities to support the amendments to be undertaken across government and non-government agencies.

### Achievement of policy objectives

The above policy objectives are achieved by fixing a commencement date of 15 July 2020 for Part 13, Divisions 1A and 8 of the Act.

### Consistency with policy objectives of authorising law

The Proclamation is consistent with the objectives of the Act.

## **Inconsistency with policy objectives of other legislation**

There is no inconsistency with the policy objectives of other legislation.

## **Alternative ways of achieving policy objectives**

There are no alternative means of achieving the purpose of the Proclamation.

## **Benefits and costs of implementation**

There are no additional costs for government associated with implementing the amendments to the YJ Act and Bail Act made by the *Community Services (Portable Long Service Leave) Act 2020*.

## **Consistency with fundamental legislative principles**

The Proclamation is consistent with fundamental legislative principles.

## **Consultation**

The Office of Best Practice Regulation was not consulted as the Proclamation is of a machinery nature and falls within the agency assessed exclusion category (g) under the *Queensland Government Guide to Better Regulation*.

No further consultation was undertaken on the Proclamation as it is of a machinery nature.
