# Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020

## **Human Rights Certificate**

#### Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the Human Rights Act 2019

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HR Act), I, the Honourable Jackie Trad MP, Deputy Premier, Treasurer and Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Superannuation* (*State Public Sector*) *Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020* (the Amendment Regulation) made under the *Superannuation* (*State Public Sector*) *Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the Amendment Regulation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the HR Act. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

#### Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the Amendment Regulation is to allow QSuper standard defined benefit category members with a terminal medical condition access to the death benefit that would otherwise become available in the future, and allow QSuper members economically affected by the COVID-19 epidemic limited access to their superannuation in line with recent changes to Commonwealth legislation.

### **Human Rights Issues**

The Amendment Regulation does not affect or engage a human right.

#### Conclusion

I consider that the Superannuation (State Public Sector) Amendment of Deed Regulation 2020 is compatible with the Human Rights Act 2019 because it does not raise a human rights issue.
