

Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (Prescribed Land) Amendment Regulation 2020

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Cameron Dick, Queensland Treasurer, Minister for Infrastructure and Planning provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (Prescribed Land) Amendment Regulation 2020* (the Amendment Regulation) made under the *Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971* (the Act).

In my opinion, the Amendment Regulation as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Act sets out the framework for prescribing land vested in the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (RNA) as Prescribed Land.

The *Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Regulation 2010* lists the description of land prescribed under section 17D of the Act. The purpose of the Amendment Regulation is to prescribe Lot 805 on SP288132 as private ownership of the RNA. The RNA has entered into agreements to develop RNA land. The subject lot is owned by and is intended to remain in the ownership of the RNA.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The Amendment Regulation does not raise any human rights issues.

Consideration of reasonable limitations on human rights (section 13 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

As the Amendment Regulation does not raise any human rights issues, it does not limit any human rights and therefore it is not necessary to consider section 13 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*.

Conclusion

I consider that the *Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland (Prescribed Land) Amendment Regulation 2020* is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
