In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019* (HRA), I, the Honourable Mark Bailey MP, Minister for Transport and Main Roads provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Proclamation – Transport and Other Legislation (Road Safety, Technology and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2020* (Proclamation) made under the *Transport and Other Legislation (Road Safety, Technology and Other Matters) Amendment Act 2020* (Road Safety and Technology Amendment Act).

In my opinion, the Proclamation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the HRA. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the Proclamation is to fix 11 September 2020 as the date for the commencement of part 10, division 3 of the Road Safety and Technology Amendment Act, which clarifies evidentiary provisions for fare evasion on public transport.

Human Rights Issues

The Proclamation does not raise a human rights issue.

Conclusion

I consider that the Proclamation is compatible with the HRA because it does not raise a human rights issue.
