Work Health and Safety (Plant Registration) Amendment Regulation 2020

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Grace Grace MP, Minister for Education and Minister for Industrial Relations, provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Work Health and Safety (Plant Registration) Amendment Regulation 2020* made under the *Work Health and Safety Act 2011*.

In my opinion, the *Work Health and Safety (Plant Registration) Amendment Regulation 2020*, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The objectives of the Work Health and Safety (Plant Registration) Amendment Regulation 2020 are to:

- maintain a requirement for annual renewal of plant item registration; and
- allow the regulator to waive and refund the plant item registration fee for amusement devices in the current plant registration cycle (1 February 2020 to 31 January 2021).

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

The amendment regulation does not affect or engage a human right under Part 2, Division 2 and 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*.

Conclusion

I consider that the Work Health and Safety (Plant Registration) Amendment Regulation 2020 is compatible with the Human Rights Act 2019 because it does not raise a human rights issue.
