Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Work Health and Safety (Codes of Practice) (Scaffolding) Amendment Notice 2021 seeks to revoke the *Scaffolding Code of Practice 2009* and approve the new *Scaffolding Code of Practice 2021*.

The *Scaffolding Code of Practice 2009* is over 10 years old, and it is considered timely for it be updated and remade to ensure it reflects current industry best practice, technological advancements and is consistent with the model work health and safety laws implemented in Queensland in 2012.

Section 274 of the *Work Health and Safety Act 2011* authorises the revoking of the *Scaffolding Code of Practice 2009* and approval of the *Scaffolding Code of Practice 2021*.
