Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, Mark Ryan, Minister for Police and Corrective Services and Minister for Fire and Emergency Services provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022*, made under the *Police Service Administration Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the *Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022*, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The *Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022* which amends the *Police Service Administration Regulation 2016* by changing the period a police officer may apply to the Commissioner for Police Service Reviews to start a review into a reviewable decision from within 14 days to within 7 days.

Human Rights Issues

The *Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022* does not affect or engage a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the *Police Service Administration (Reviews) Amendment Regulation 2022* is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
