Proclamation to commence specific provisions of the *Inspector of Detention Services Act 2022*

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the Human Rights Act 2019

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Shannon Fentiman MP, Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, Minister for Women and the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence, provide this human rights certificate with respect to the Proclamation to commence: Part 1 to the extent it is not in force other than section 3; Part 2, Division 1; Part 5, other than sections 36, 37 and 38; section 51; Part 7, Division 6 other than sections 86, 93, 94, 96, 97, 98; Part 7, Division 7; and Schedule 1 of the *Inspector of Detention Services Act 2022* on 9 December 2022.

In my opinion, the Proclamation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Proclamation fixes 9 December 2022 as the day for the commencement of specific provisions in the *Inspector of Detention Services Act 2022*.

Human Rights Issues

There are no human rights relevant to the Proclamation.

Conclusion

I consider that the Proclamation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise any human rights issues.
