

Proclamation No. 2 – Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021

Human Rights Certificate

Prepared in accordance with Part 3 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*

In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable Annastacia Palaszczuk MP, Premier and Minister for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Proclamation no. 2 – Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021* made under the *Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021*.

In my opinion, the proclamation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The purpose of the proclamation is to fix 14 April 2023 as the date to commence certain parts of the *Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021* stated in the Schedule.

The provisions of the *Queensland Veterans' Council Act 2021* that are commenced by the proclamation will establish the Queensland Veterans' Council's function to administer the Anzac Day Trust Fund under the *Anzac Day Act 1995*; amend the *Anzac Day Act 1995* to abolish the Anzac Day Trust; and transfer responsibility for the administration of the Anzac Day Trust Fund from the Anzac Day Trust to the Queensland Veterans' Council.

Human Rights Issues

Human rights relevant to the subordinate legislation (Part 2, Division 2 and 3 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

As the proclamation is machinery in nature, it does not affect or engage any human rights.

Consideration of reasonable limitations on human rights (section 13 *Human Rights Act 2019*)

As the proclamation itself does not raise any human rights issues, it is not necessary to consider section 13 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*.

Conclusion

I consider that the proclamation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not raise a human rights issue.
