In accordance with section 41 of the *Human Rights Act 2019*, I, the Honourable David Janetzki MP, Treasurer, Minister for Energy and Minister for Home Ownership provide this human rights certificate with respect to the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) (Parental Leave) and Other Legislation Amendment Regulation 2025* (Amendment Regulation) made under the *Superannuation (State Public Sector) Act 1990*.

In my opinion, the Amendment Regulation, as tabled in the Legislative Assembly, is compatible with the human rights protected by the *Human Rights Act 2019*. I base my opinion on the reasons outlined in this statement.

Overview of the Subordinate Legislation

The Amendment Regulation amends Superannuation (State Public Sector) Regulation 2023 to implement a policy initiative of the Queensland Government to pay superannuation to public sector employees when they are on parental leave without pay, a measure that improves their superannuation. The Amendment Regulation also makes minor amendments to the Superannuation (State Public Sector) Notice 2021 to provide more flexible superannuation for employees of Gladstone Ports Corporation Ltd, update the name of a public sector employer, and make a minor technical amendment to correct an incorrect term.

Human Rights Issues

The Amendment Regulation does not impact a human right.

Conclusion

I consider that the Amendment Regulation is compatible with the *Human Rights Act 2019* because it does not limit human rights.
