1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Tattoo Industry (Fees) Amendment Regulation 2017*.

2 Regulation amended

This regulation amends the *Tattoo Industry Regulation 2013*.

5 Partial refund of fees

The chief executive must refund a reasonable amount of a fee paid on an application for a licence, or the renewal of a licence, if—

- (a) the chief executive refuses to grant or renew the licence; or
- (b) the applicant withdraws the application before the licence is granted or renewed.
