5 Amendment of sch 1H (Pormpuraaw)

(1) Schedule 1H, section 2(b)—

omit, insert—

- (b) 4.5L of—
 - (i) permissible beer; or
 - (ii) pre-mixed drink; or
 - (iii) any combination of permissible beer and pre-mixed drink; and
- (c) for any other liquor—zero.
- (2) Schedule 1H, section 2—

insert—

(2) In this section—

permissible beer means beer in which the concentration of alcohol is not more than 4%.

pre-mixed drink means a drink, prepared by a manufacturer, of liquor mixed with a beverage in which the concentration of alcohol is not more than 4% of the drink.
