1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Health Ombudsman* Regulation 2014.

2 Commencement

This regulation commences on 1 July 2014.

3 Corresponding interstate interim orders—Act, s 77

For section 77 of the Act, each of the following is a corresponding interstate interim order—

- (a) an interim prohibition order under section 41AA of the *Health Care Complaints Act 1993* (NSW);
- (b) an order under section 56B of the *Health and Community Services Complaints Act 2004* (SA).

4 Corresponding interstate orders—Act, s 114

For section 114 of the Act, each of the following is a corresponding interstate order—

- (a) a prohibition order under section 41A of the *Health* Care Complaints Act 1993 (NSW);
- (b) an order under section 56C of the *Health and Community Services Complaints Act 2004* (SA).

For section 288 of the Act, each of the following is a prescribed conduct document—
