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EDUCATION (SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDIES) REGULATION 1999

[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 1 July 2002]

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Education (Senior Secondary School Studies) Regulation 1999*.

PART 2—MEMBERSHIP OF COMMITTEES

2 Membership of moderation committee—Act, s 34

(1) The board must appoint the following persons as members of the moderation committee—

- (a) the director;
- (b) the chairperson of each of 2 subject advisory committees decided by the board;
- (c) 5 persons chosen by the board—
 - (i) who are recognised by the board as having expertise in moderation; and
 - (ii) whose combined expertise is representative of the range of board subjects or groups of board subjects studied in senior secondary schools in Queensland;
- (d) other persons the board considers necessary.

(2) Unless the board otherwise decides, the director is the chairperson of the committee.

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(3) In this section—

“**senior secondary school**” means a school providing senior secondary education.

3 Membership of subject advisory committees—Act, s 36

(1) The board must appoint the following persons as members of a subject advisory committee—

- (a) 1 person chosen by the board who is recognised by the board as having knowledge of the relevant subject and experience in managing committees;
- (b) 1 person chosen by the board who is recognised by the board as having expertise in moderation in the relevant subject;
- (c) 2 persons, chosen by the board from nominations given to the board by non-State school organisations, who are—
 - (i) recognised by the board as leading practitioners in the teaching of the relevant subject; and
 - (ii) teachers in non-State secondary schools;
- (d) 4 nominees of the chief executive who are—
 - (i) recognised by the board as leading practitioners in the teaching of the relevant subject; and
 - (ii) teachers in State secondary schools;
- (e) 1 nominee of the chief executive who is an officer of the department involved in curriculum implementation support;
- (f) 1 nominee of the parent entities who, at the time of appointment, is a parent of—
 - (i) a person attending year 11 or 12 at a State educational institution or other school in Queensland; or
 - (ii) a person expected to attend year 11 or 12 at a State educational institution or other school in Queensland during the term of the appointment; or
 - (iii) a person who attended year 11 or 12 at a State educational institution or other school in Queensland and whose last day

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of attendance was not earlier than 2 years before the day of appointment;

- (g) 4 nominees of the Higher Education Forum who represent institutions providing higher education;
- (h) 1 nominee of a learned association recognised by the board as having expertise in the relevant subject;
- (i) 1 nominee of an industry association recognised by the board as being knowledgeable about, and representative of, the industry to which the relevant subject primarily relates;
- (j) 1 nominee of the director of the Office of the Queensland School Curriculum Council;
- (k) other persons the board considers—
 - (i) have expertise in the relevant subject; or
 - (ii) will contribute to the committee's work.

(2) The person mentioned in subsection (1)(a) is the chairperson of the committee.

(3) The chairperson of the board must arrange for meetings of representatives of the parent entities to nominate a person for appointment to a subject advisory committee under subsection (1)(f).

(4) The representatives may participate in the meetings by telephone, closed circuit television or another way permitting contemporaneous communication with other representatives.

(5) Before the board accepts a nomination of a person under subsection (1)(i), the board must consult with the Vocational Education, Training and Employment Commission about whether the industry association is sufficiently knowledgeable about, and representative of, the industry to make the nomination.

(6) In this section—

“learned association” means an association or society of persons recognised by the board as having expertise in a subject.

Example—

An association of persons who teach a subject.

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“non-State school” means a school that is provisionally accredited, or accredited, under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001*.

“non-State secondary school” means a non-State school at which secondary education is provided.

“parent entities” means the following entities—

- (a) Queensland Council of Parents and Citizens’ Associations Incorporated;
- (b) Federation of Parents and Friends Associations of Catholic Schools, Queensland;
- (c) Independent Parents and Friends Council of Queensland.

“relevant subject” means the subject, or one of the group of subjects, for which the committee is appointed.

“State secondary school” means a school at which secondary education is provided by the State.

“Vocational Education, Training and Employment Commission” means the Vocational Education, Training and Employment Commission established under the *Vocational Education, Training and Employment Act 1991*, section 6.

PART 3—CERTAIN MATTERS ABOUT THE BOARD AND COMMITTEES

4 Application of part

This part applies to the moderation committee and subject advisory committees.

5 Quorum for meetings

- (1) The board or a committee may not meet unless it has a quorum.

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(2) The number required for a quorum is the number that is half of the number of members of which the board or committee for the time being consists or, if that number is not a whole number, the next whole number.

6 Casual vacancies on committees

(1) The board may appoint a person to fill a vacancy in the membership of a committee.

(2) A person appointed under subsection (1) must have similar qualifications to the person being replaced.

(3) The term of the appointment is the balance of the term for which the person being replaced was appointed.

7 How committees exercise power

(1) At a meeting of a committee, a question is to be decided by a majority of the votes of the committee's members present and voting.

(2) Each member has a vote on each question arising for decision and, if the votes are equal, the chairperson of the committee has a casting vote.

(3) A member who abstains from voting is taken to have voted in the negative.

8 Term of appointment of committee members

(1) A member of the moderation committee must be appointed for a term of 4 years.

(2) A member of a subject advisory committee must be appointed for a term of not more than 4 years.

PART 4—REPEAL

9 Repeal of regulation

The *Education (Senior Secondary School Studies) Regulation 1989* is repealed.
