POLICE POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES (AUSTRALIAN RUGBY UNION TEST—WALLABIES V ENGLAND) REGULATION 2004

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Police Powers and Responsibilities (Australian Rugby Union Test—Wallabies v England) Regulation 2004*.

2 ‘Australian Rugby Union Test—Wallabies v England’ is a special event

A rugby match between Australia and England being held on 26 June 2004 and known as ‘Australian Rugby Union Test—Wallabies v England’ is a special event for the Act, chapter 9, part 2.¹

3 Special event site

(1) A special event site for the match is the area comprised of—

- (a) Suncorp Stadium, Castlemaine Street, Milton; and
- (b) Caxton Street, Castlemaine Street, Hale Street and Milton Road, Milton to the extent the streets adjoin the perimeter of Suncorp Stadium; and
- (c) Chippendall Street, Milton.

(2) The site includes any facilities associated with the site.

(3) In this section—

“**facilities**” includes—

- (a) pedestrian and vehicular entrances and exits; and

- (b) driveways; and
- (c) carparks; and
- (d) garden and service areas; and
- (e) recreational areas.

4 Period of special event

The period for which the event is a special event starts on 25 June 2004 and ends at midnight on 27 June 2004.

5 Where authorised persons may exercise powers for special event

During the special event, an authorised person may exercise powers the authorised person has under the Act, chapter 9, part 2, division 5² at a special event site.

6 Prohibited items

Each item in the schedule is a prohibited item.³

7 Expiry

This regulation expires on 28 June 2004.

² Act, chapter 9 (Other powers), part 2 (Preserving safety for special events), division 5 (Powers for special event sites). An authorised person may exercise a power in division 5 only if the person's instrument of appointment states the person may exercise the power.

³ Under the *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000*, section 356 (Prohibited items) taking a prohibited item onto, or possessing a prohibited item on, a special event site without a reasonable excuse is an offence.

SCHEDULE

PROHIBITED ITEMS

section 6

1. A noxious or offensive substance or an offensive weapon.

Examples—

- animal manure
 - paint
 - a spear or a sword
2. Any of the following under the *Weapons Categories Regulation 1997*—
 - a category A, B, C, D, E, H, M or R weapon
 - a restricted item.
 3. The following items—
 - an antique firearm within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990*
 - a captive bolt humane killer
 - an explosive tool
 - a knife within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990*, section 51⁴
 - a major component part of a firearm within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990*
 - a shanghai within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990*
 - a slingshot within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990*
 - a crossbow
 - a longbow
 - a spear gun
 - a replica of a crossbow, longbow or spear gun.

⁴ *Weapons Act 1990*, section 51 (Possession of a knife in a public place or a school)

SCHEDULE (continued)

4. A graffiti instrument under the *Vagrants, Gaming and Other Offences Act 1931*.
5. A placard attached to a rigid object, for example, a piece of timber by which it may be held.
6. An animal, reptile or insect capable of causing physical harm if released in close proximity to a person.
7. An item, including a device known as a 'dragon', capable of—
 - (a) attaching a person to an object or another person; or
 - (b) preventing removal of any locking or connecting device.
8. Liquor, other than liquor to be sold or supplied on the site under the authority of a licence or permit issued under the *Liquor Act 1992*.
9. A thing capable of emitting a sound loud enough to disrupt the rugby match.
10. A communication device, other than a mobile phone, capable of being used to organise activity designed to disrupt the rugby match.

Example—

A two-way radio

11. Any of the following things capable of being used to cause harm to a person or to disrupt the rugby match—

- an explosive

Examples—

1. fireworks
2. flares

- glass bottles or jars
- metal cans or tins
- projectiles

Examples—

1. stones or rocks
2. metal nuts
3. bolts

SCHEDULE (continued)

4. marbles
 5. ball bearings
- hand tools
 - a smoke bomb
 - a laser light pointer
 - a flag pole
 - a thing capable of disguising or concealing the identity of a person
 - a thing capable of being used to climb barriers
 - a thing capable of being used to construct a stage, platform, tripod or tower or a structure similar to a stage, platform, tripod or tower.
