Police Powers and Responsibilities (APEC) Regulation 2007

[as amended by all amendments that commenced on or before 9 July 2007]

Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This regulation may be cited as the *Police Powers and Responsibilities (APEC) Regulation 2007*.

2 Definitions

In this regulation—

APEC means Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation.

barricade includes a temporary barrier or roadblock.

Part 3 Declaration of special event at Coolum

9 Declaration of APEC meeting at Coolum as special event

- (1) The event consisting of the APEC meeting, Finance Ministers Meeting to be held at Coolum from 30 July 2007 to 3 August 2007 is declared to be a special event for chapter 19, part 2 of the Act.
- (2) For subsection (1), the APEC meeting includes the following—
 - (a) functions attended by APEC delegates;

- (b) entertainment events held for the benefit of APEC delegates;
- (c) accommodation of APEC delegates, APEC officials and other officials associated with the organisation of APEC;
- (d) the arrival of APEC delegates, APEC officials and other officials associated with the organisation of APEC at Sunshine Coast Airport and their departure from it.

10 Special event site

- (1) Each area described in schedule 2 is a special event site for the special event.
- (2) However, a special event site for the special event does not include a place that is not a public place.
- (3) If part of a boundary of a special event site for the special event is a street, that part of the boundary runs along the outer side of the street.
- (4) Subsection (5) applies if—
 - (a) part of a boundary of a special event site runs along the outer side of a street; and
 - (b) the next part of the boundary runs along the outer side of another street that intersects with the street.
- (5) Both parts of the boundary continue in a direct line until the parts intersect.
- (6) If part of a barricade, fence or wall lies on a boundary of a special event site for the special event, the area on which the barricade, fence or wall is situated is included in the special event site.
- (7) In this section—

outer side, of a street, means the side which if used as a boundary would give a greater area of the special event site than the inner side of the street.

Example—

The northern side of Warran Road is the outer side of that street.
street includes a road, parade, terrace, drive or way.

11 Period of special event

The period for which the special event declaration under section 9 is in force starts on 29 July 2007 and ends at midnight on 3 August 2007.

12 Where authorised persons may exercise powers for special event

During the special event, an authorised person may exercise powers the authorised person has under chapter 19, part 2, division 5 of the Act at a special event site for the special event.

Note—

Under the *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000*, section 563 (Appointment of authorised persons), an authorised person may exercise a power in division 5 only if the person's instrument of appointment states the person may exercise the power.

13 Prohibited items

Each item mentioned in schedule 3 is a prohibited item.

Note—

Under the *Police Powers and Responsibilities Act 2000*, section 574 (Prohibited items), taking a prohibited item onto, or possessing a prohibited item on, a special event site without a reasonable excuse is an offence.

Part 4 Expiry

14 Expiry

This regulation expires on 5 August 2007.

Schedule 1 Special event sites for APEC meetings at Cairns

section 4

1 Cairns Convention Centre

The area at Cairns within the following boundary—

- (a) Sheridan Street from Wharf Street to Hartley Street;
- (b) Hartley Street from Sheridan Street to Grafton Street;
- (c) Grafton Street from Sheridan Street to its southern end and continuing in line with the area's Grafton Street boundary to the intersection with Wharf Street;
- (d) Wharf Street from that intersection to the point where the area's boundary starts.

2 The Esplanade to Marlin Marina and Reef Fleet Terminal

The area at Cairns within the following boundary—

- (a) the Esplanade from Spence Street to Shields Street;
- (b) a direct line to the low water mark of Trinity Inlet at the northern tip of Sail Fish Key, Marlin Marina;
- (c) along the low water mark to the southern tip of Reef Fleet Terminal, Spence Street;
- (d) a direct line to the point where the area's boundary starts.

3 Area easterly from Spence Street bounded to the south by Lake Street

The area at Cairns within the following boundary—

- (a) Wharf Street from Spence Street to Marlin Parade;
- (b) Marlin Parade from Wharf Street to the eastern end of Marlin Parade and continuing in line with the area's

Marlin Parade boundary to the low water mark of Trinity Inlet;

- (c) along the low water mark to a point in line with the northern side of Abbott Street;
- (d) a direct line to the northern side of Abbott Street;
- (e) Wharf Street from Abbott Street to Lake Street;
- (f) Lake Street from Wharf Street to Spence Street;
- (g) Spence Street from Lake Street to the point where the area's boundary starts.

4 Part of Trinity Inlet and its western shore

- (1) The area of the waters and western shore of Trinity Inlet that is—
 - (a) south of the southern tip of the Cairns Seaport, wharf 6; and
 - (b) north of the northern tip of Sail Fish Key, Marlin Marina.
- (2) However, the area does not include the area on which the following are situated—
 - (a) Cairns Port Authority ferry pontoons;
 - (b) wharves used as mooring points for commercial vessels.

5 Cairns International Airport

The area of the following—

- (a) Cairns International Airport, other than the following—
 - (i) an airside security zone under the *Aviation Transport Security Act 2004* (Cwlth);
 - (ii) a landside security zone under the *Aviation Transport Security Act 2004* (Cwlth);

- (iii) a secure area under the *Aviation Transport Security Regulations 2005* (Cwlth);
- (b) Airport Avenue, North Cairns.

Schedule 2 Special events sites for APEC meeting at Coolum

section 10

1 Land at Yaroomba

The area at Yaroomba within the following boundary—

- (a) Tanah Street West from its southern end to Jeenon Street;
- (b) Jeenon Street from Tanah Street West to Toolga Street;
- (c) Toolga Street from Jeenon Street to Lagoda Drive;
- (d) Lagoda Drive from Toolga Street to Beryl Terrace;
- (e) Beryl Terrace from Lagoda Drive to Warrack Street;
- (f) Warrack Street from Beryl Terrace to Centenary Heights Road;
- (g) Centenary Heights Road from Warrack Street to Jeynor Street;
- (h) Jeynor Street from Centenary Heights Road to Warran Road;
- (i) Warran Road from Jeynor Street to David Low Way;
- (j) David Low Way from Warran Road to Warragah Parade;
- (k) Warragah Parade from David Low Way to the eastern end of Warragah Parade;
- (l) along a line running seaward from the eastern end of Warragah Parade to the low water mark of the Pacific Ocean;
- (m) along the low water mark to its intersection with a line running seaward from the eastern end of Tanah Street East;
- (n) along that line to the eastern end of Tanah Street East;
- (o) Tanah Street East from its eastern end to the point where the area's boundary starts.

Schedule 2 (continued)

2 Sunshine Coast Airport

The area of the following—

- (a) Sunshine Coast Airport, Mudjimba, other than the following—
 - (i) an airside security zone under the *Aviation Transport Security Act 2004* (Cwlth);
 - (ii) a landside security zone under the *Aviation Transport Security Act 2004* (Cwlth);
 - (iii) a secure area under the *Aviation Transport Security Regulations 2005* (Cwlth);
- (b) Friendship Avenue, Mudjimba.

Schedule 3 Prohibited items

sections 7 and 13

- 1 A noxious or offensive substance.
Example—
 animal manure
- 2 An offensive weapon.
Example—
 a spear
- 3 Any of the following under the *Weapons Categories Regulation 1997—*
 - a category A, B, C, D, E, H, M or R weapon
 - a restricted item.
- 4 Any of the following items within the meaning of the *Weapons Act 1990—*
 - an antique firearm
 - a knife¹
 - a major component part of a firearm
 - a shanghai
 - a slingshot
 - a sword.
- 5 Any of the following items—
 - a captive bolt humane killer
 - an explosive tool
 - a longbow
 - a spear gun

1 See the *Weapons Act 1990*, section 51 (Possession of a knife in a public place or a school).

Schedule 3 (continued)

- a replica of a crossbow, longbow or spear gun.
- 6 Any of the following things capable of being used to cause harm to a person—
- an explosive
- Examples—*
- 1 fireworks
 - 2 flares
- glass bottles or jars
 - metal cans or tins
 - projectiles
- Examples—*
- 1 stones
 - 2 ball bearings
- hand tools.
- 7 A graffiti instrument within the meaning of the *Summary Offences Act 2005*.
- 8 Any reptile, insect or other animal capable of causing physical harm if released in close proximity to a person.
- 9 An item, including a device known as a ‘dragon’, capable of—
- (a) attaching a person to an object or another person; or
 - (b) preventing removal of any locking or connecting device.
- 10 A communication device, other than a mobile phone, capable of being used to organise activity designed to disrupt the special event.
- Example—*
- a two-way radio
- 11 Part or all of a traffic barrier.
- 12 Any of the following things capable of disrupting the special event—

Schedule 3 (continued)

- a thing capable of emitting a sound loud enough to disrupt the special event

Examples—

- 1 a loud hailer
 - 2 a horn
- a smoke bomb
 - a thing capable of being used to climb barriers
 - a thing capable of being used to construct a stage, platform, tripod or tower or a structure similar to a stage, platform, tripod or tower.
- 13 A thing capable of disguising or concealing the identity of a person.
